Typical Problem Photos

Typically, there are two categories of photos that can, and do, create problems that can easily be fixed with an image editor.

Buildings, such as churches and archives
Tombstones

Typical Problem Photos

Buildings

Usually one is too close to a building when photographing it, creating a problem with perspective.

Typical Problem Photos

Tombstones

It's not uncommon to be forced to photograph a tombstone from less than an ideal location.

Rotation, tilting, perspective correction and cropping are typical applications of an image editor.






Perspective correction was used to bring the vertical lines into better alignment. The hydro company will have to correct the pole.




Not wanting to step onto a busy road, this was as far away as I could safely be to photograph this church. However, the resulting photograph suffers from distortion.




Distortion was fixed with the perspective correction tool in ACDSee Pro.




This photo needs several types of edits to appear correct.



First, rotation of the image while observing the inscription.



Next, perspective correction in three directions, observing vertical lines.

Next, crop the image to remove background clutter.
