
Loyalist Palmer farm, Central Hampstead, Queens County, New Brunswick. Oldest standing building dated 1793.





Meacham Atlas - 1880






Loyalist Land Petitions





Copy of birth record provided by province of New Brunswick.








Baptismal record, St. Martin in the Fields, London, William Dyer (8ggu), bapt. 24 October 1634.










Mrs. Amelia Brown


The death of Mrs. Amelia Brown, widow of the late Chas. E. Brown, who was formerly section foreman of the C.N.R. at Sassex, occurred at the hospital in Moncton on Thursday. May 17th. The deceased, who has been in failing health for the last month, has recently resided in Montreal and different parts of the United States with her son Harold and for the past six months has lived with her daughter, Mrs. G. N. Palmer, Moncton.

She leaves to mourn, two gons, G. Harold, of Des Moines, Iowa, and Harry, of Campbellton; also daughters, Mrs. King Hall, of Rhodesia, South Africa, and Mrs. G. N. Palmer, of Moncton. Her eldest son Stanley H. Brown, died suddenly in Montreal on Monday last and was buried in Amherst' on Wednesday of last week. The body arrived in Sussex at noon on the Maritime Express on aturday, 19th. Interment took place immediately on the arrival of the train to Kirk Hill cemetery. Rev. N. A. McNelll officiated at the grave.






