Image Mapping Using TMG Utility ~ An Update

Today's presentation will incorporate TMG Utility ver. 7.3 Build 1 & Second Site ver. 5.0 Build 9 by John Cardinal, and TMG ver. 8.08 by Wholly Genes. These are the current versions of each of the three applications as of this writing.

Edit Exhibit Image Map is a tool in TMG Utility for creating HTML image maps that can be used with Second Site. Image maps are useful in creating multiple clickable regions within a single exhibit.

It is intended to be used with **external exhibits**, but can also be used to edit any image format that is recognized by TMG.

How would an image map appear on a Second Site page?

Imagine having a family portrait where you could click on any face and display the page for that person.

A click on each face will display that person's page



From conversations with John Cardinal I will share the following definitions, which will help in your experience with creating image maps.

- John, what's the difference between an image and an exhibit?
 - "An image is a digital graphic such as a scanned photograph or document.
 - * An **exhibit** is a TMG data item that associates an image with a person, event, name, place, source or citation as recorded in the TMG database."

* "Let's say you have scanned a photograph of someone. At that point, you have a digital image. When you decide to add the image to a person's record in your TMG project, you add an exhibit and along the way you tell TMG the path to the image file. Now you have both the original image and you have a separate, but related, exhibit. The image is not the exhibit, and the exhibit is not the image. The image is referenced by the exhibit."


* "TMGU will store the image map in the exhibit record if you start the process with the [Edit Exhibit Image Map] button, and then select an exhibit."

- * "If you start with the [Edit Image Map] button, TMGU will NOT change an exhibit record because you haven't picked one, you've chosen an image file instead."
- * Thank you, John. **Sage advice**: Remember the contents of these previous three slides for when you begin the mapping process in TMGU.

13. The mouse cursor displayed anywhere within the exhibit frame will change to a '+'.


14. While holding the left mouse button down draw boxes around each face in the exhibit.




15. Boxes are displayed for each person

17. Double click each box to enter or edit area properties.






18. Type the TMG ID number for each person, in this format.

20. Click OK.




21. For unknown persons leave the **HREF** field blank.


22. Enter some appropriate text in the **Title** and **Alternate** fields.


This is one example of being able to click on each face in the family portrait to instantly view their person page.

Tombstone Inscriptions


- * A side note on recording tombstones.
- My practice, in order, is to photograph the entire marker, then a closeup of the inscription on the front.
- * If they exist, I then photograph closeups of the inscriptions on the left, right and back faces, in that order.
- If they exist, I then photograph foot stones.
- If they exist, I then photograph family member flat stones
- * I digress documenting cemeteries is an entire other topic

Tombstone Inscriptions

As in the case of mapping snapshots or formal portraits, one can map tombstone inscriptions.





- 1. Exhibits in TMG Exhibit Log, consisting of front view of tombstone, details of front, left and right inscriptions.

- 3. Click Properties




In this example the detail of the front inscription was selected




This Person Page is already focused on Hezekiah Seaman. Click on any of the other three names on the mapped image to view their page.
