### Tip: Reunion Account

- Does anybody have any ideas for handling a newspaper account of a reunion? A newspaper covered the reunion back in 1895; its a rather long piece with lots of names. Its a treasure trove. But how do I record it?
- Make a history group tag and link each person to it, with the particulars about that person in the witness menu. You might use different roles to adjust the sentence for the sort of information you have on each person, or not. I would also attach the whole item as an exhibit to the tag.
- If you use Second Site, and make the exhibit linked, then if you go to the exhibit, it can now have a back link to each person connected to it, so you can use that to browse through everyone connected with the event.

## "Say" Dates

- TMG basically recognizes seven date modifiers (plus their various abbreviations):
  - After
  - Before
  - Circa (or About)
  - Between \_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_
  - From \_\_\_\_\_ to \_\_\_\_
  - Say (or Est)

– \_\_\_\_ or \_\_\_\_

 About and Est are automatically changed to Circa and Say.

## "Say" Dates

- Help: "Say" is a date based on some other event date.
- From the work of Robert Charles Anderson, the well-known researcher of early New England. He explains his method in his "The Great Migration Begins" series.
  - The approximation of dates may be done in a variety of ways. The most desirable manner of approximating dates is from a piece of evidence which states an age, or in some other way describes a specific span of years. If an age at death, or an age at the time of a deposition is available, then a year of birth may be estimated, and in such a case the entry will read "b. about 1634," indicating a date that is reliable with a relatively narrow span of years, perhaps just two years above or below the estimated date.
  - More frequently the evidence for estimating an age will be less precise, and we will have to state an age in a different way: saying that someone was "b. say 1634," meaning that this is our best estimate, but that it may be some years off in either direction. We may only have a date of first marriage, from which we will state a likely birth date based on the usual age at first marriage. There are many other indicators which help us to establish these broad ranges.

### Name Variations

- How can I get reports to use the new surname when a woman remarries?
- All TMG event tags have the capability to specify which of several names defined for a person by tags in the Name group (such as a standard Name-Married tag) should be used in the narrative output of this tag.
